## Master's Course Schedule for Summer 2019

### **AH 880.10 Creating Vital Congregations for Social Change (3 hrs.)**

**Instructor: Dr. Annie Lockhart-Gilroy**

**Intensive: June 10-14**

This course, rooted in public theology, is designed to give congregational leaders a foundation in which engagement in the public square is not a distraction from the mission of the church, but a fulfillment of it. Students will engage with works from scholars, pastors, and faith based activists. Students will also have an opportunity to study congregations that are active in their communities and work towards social change. Students will also create projects for their own contexts that will be meant to enrich their congregations and the communities of which the congregation is a part.

### **DS 500 History and Polity of the Disciples of Christ (3 hrs.)**

**Intensive: June 10-14**

The origin, development, organization, and theological interests of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) studied in the context of American social and religious history. Required of all Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) students preparing for ordination. **This course meeting M-F 8:30 a.m.**

**– 5:00 p.m. Recommended Prerequisites: Phase I courses.**

### **SP 800.04 Christian Spiritual Traditions (3 hrs.)**

**Instructor: Dr. Amy Oden**

**Intensive: June 17-21**

This is an overview of some major traditions of Christian spirituality spanning the time period from the New Testament to the twentieth century. The course involves close reading, and analysis of selected texts. Students also practice a range of Christian spiritual disciplines as part of the course work. **This course meets M-F 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. No Prerequisites.**
