Master's Course Schedule for Summer 2020

TC 900.07 Immersion Travel: Native America-Oklahoma (3 hrs.)

Instructor: Dr. Lisa Barnett

Intensive: May 27 – June 4

A study trip to different locations in northern Oklahoma and northeastern Oklahoma communities. The rationale for multiple sites is to expose students to the diversity of Native American peoples and cultures represented in what is often misunderstood to be a monolithic Native American/American Indian identity. While focusing on the diversity of Native American communities, the purpose of the immersion course is also to highlight similar cultural and social changes upon Native peoples from hundreds of years of colonialism and assimilation efforts and Native American efforts to resist these centripetal and centrifugal forces. A significant portion of the course will be devoted to hearing Native voices around issues of sovereignty, economics and employment, housing, crime, health, racism, education, politics, environment, etc. that impact Indian Country today. Additionally, opportunities to engage with Native peoples in cultural and socio-religion settings (both tribal and Native Christian) will be available. **An immersion fee of \$350, which partially covers travel, food, and lodging expenses will be assessed. This fee is nonrefundable once travel and housing arrangements have been made. In addition, students will need to complete an Immersion Course Enrollment form by April 3.** Pre-trip assignments and a post-trip meeting will be arranged. Students are responsible for meals in route to and from Phillips Theological Seminary, where the course will begin and end. The group will depart from Phillips on May 27 and the course will officially end in the afternoon of June 4 (Distant students will travel to Tulsa on May 27 and will depart Tulsa on June 5 – we allow students to fly to Tulsa if their origination airport is more than 500 miles from Tulsa). **Prerequisite: completion of History of Christianity I and II (HC 502 and HC 504). Recommended prerequisite: AH 880.09 Introduction to Native American Religious Beliefs and Practices. Priority enrollment for the first 11 students who enroll.**

PT 535 Adolescent Spirituality (3 hrs.)

Instructor: Dr. Annie Lockhart-Gilroy

Intensive: June 15-19

The aim of this course will be to broaden our understanding of the spiritual development and faith formation of youth. The course will explore the human development and culture of Generation Z, the context necessary for spiritual development to take place, and various models and modes of practical theology that can be used in providing youth a faith passage from adolescence to young adulthood. **This course meets M-F 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. No Prerequisites.**

Students may enroll in these courses from March 23 – May 8.
